

Assessment Process

Testing is comprehensive and usually takes a full day, beginning at 9:00 am.

Clinical Interview: This interview allows the examiner to compile a brief history of your difficulties that led you to seek evaluation.

Learning Disability Assessment: This portion of the assessment includes an evaluation of intellectual/cognitive functioning and academic achievement (school-based learning) in order to diagnose specific learning disabilities.

ADHD Assessment: In order to diagnose ADHD, we utilize self-report checklists completed by multiple people as well as a computerized measure of attention.

Personality Assessment: This utilizes a number of self-report measures in order to identify psychological symptoms as well as personality characteristics.

Study Skills Evaluation: This utilizes a self-report measure to identify strengths and areas of difficulty in studying.

Directions to Our Office

From Jackson Avenue, turn on to Rebel Drive to enter campus. Continue on Rebel Drive as it curves to the right. The last building on the right before the blue water tower is Kinard Hall. Parking is located behind the building. Enter at the door on the back left side of the building and we are located on the third floor.
